Author to speak on chances of cyber-terrorism attack

SOUTH BEND -- Author and engineer Bill Neugent will present a speech, "Cyber-terrorism: We're Toast," at 7 p.m. Wednesday at Indiana University South Bend.

The event, which is free and open to the public, will be in Room 113, Northside Hall.

Neugent will speak about computer vulnerability, the possibility of a cyber attack on the United States and how the country can work to prevent such an attack.

Neugent is chief engineer for cyber-security at Mitre Corp., with headquarters in Bedford, Mass., and McLean, Va. It is a nonprofit group that works in the public interest to explore technology.

Neugent authored a novel, "No Outward Sign," which explores a fictional computer attack by Iraq.
